## Sam Brownback Campaign Stop Meeting

My definition of a "Campaign Stop" meeting is when a candidate(s) speaks and then has as a question and answer time. This meeting had NO question and answer time; only the candidates' brief speeches. Candidate for Governor, Sam Brownback and Jeff Colyer, candidate for Lt. Governor made a brief Campaign Stop. There was no opportunity to ask questions.

Not counting family and press there were about 30 people present.
This was a short stop to layout the Goals for the "Road Map for Kansas". There are 5 points that will have the greatest influence on growing the economy and reforming state government. My thoughts on Governor-to-be, Sam Brownback, are: He could/should have polled (online?) the people of Kansas as to what we feel will help Kansas: 1) Repeal Sales Tax; 2) Freeze state government spending; 3) Stop the Federal spending, mandates, and Federal money on sinking this State into debt that is not sustainable. Also stopping Federal Health Care, Federal Control on Education and Bailouts for Unions. Then he could push for Kansas Sovereignty and you won't have to sell this State to anyone. Candidate Brownback gave a 15-20 minute talk and covered none of these items.

We have received more info from "Our Manhattan".
TENTATIVELY, another County Commissioner forum has been scheduled for October $6^{\text {th }}$ from 6 to 8 PM at the Manhattan City Library, Main Auditorium.

Format:

6:00-6:05: Pledge of Allegiance.
6:05 to 6:15: Our Manhattan introduction and stating of forum Rules.
6:15 to 6:25: Candidates get 3 minutes each to introduce themselves.
6:25 to 7:05: MC asks each candidate 5 scripted question and each candidate gets 3 minutes to answer.

7:05 to 7:50: Audience submits questions for the candidates. Each candidate gets 3 minutes each to answer.

7:50 to 8:00: Closing each Candidate gets 5 minutes to describe their platform and why they want to be county commissioner.

8:00 to 8:30: Clean up.

## Recommendations:

1. Joe Knopp, Kent Stewart, Wayne Converse, Wynn Butler, John Matta and Kelly Gulker form the committee to script the 5 questions and present them to OM. (No two part questions, that force a candidate to a specific answer).
2. If I could get John Meredith, Troy Mattingly and Kent Stewart to help me with set-up.
3. I suggest Wynn Butler or John Matta serve as MC or Co-MCs.
4. If I could get 3-4 people to help with cleanup.
5. This time we'll make sure the Mercury and several radio stations are there.
6. Recommend Holly and Rob serve as timekeepers again.

## Notes:

1. Oct $6^{\text {th }}$ is 4 weeks prior to the election and one week prior to early voting beginning.
2. We'll videotape the event again.
3. We'll place the timekeepers in a better place, more visible to the candidates.
4. We'll use microphones for better sound volume.
5. We'll have a .ppt presentation to accompany the forum; display the questions and pertinent information on a screen or the wall while it is being discussed. PPT presentation. Example: OM logo and e-mail address and web site displayed as people arrive; then project the Pledge of Allegiance; then project the intro and rules; then project question 1 , then 2 , etc., etc.
6. We'll do a better job of signing people in. Have OM cards and a flyer on the sign in desk.
7. Have a table for candidates for any office can place campaign flyers.
8. We'd like to strongly improve on the 43 people in attendance. I think as our credibility increases we could get up to 75 people of all political persuasions. Wouldn't that be great?
